## **Priest Report to the General Assembly**

## **Holy Cross Mission Statement**

The mission of Holy Cross is to keep and proclaim, pure and undefiled, the Orthodox Christian Faith and traditions in conformity with the doctrine, canons, worship, discipline, and customs of the Church.

## **HOLY CROSS CHURCH VISION**

The Holy Cross Parish, an extension of the Body of Christ and a microcosm of the Orthodox Faith, incorporates into itself all that reveals the Good News of Salvation to a fallen world. The spiritual power and dynamic energy that gives life to the Body of Jesus is our worship, whose center is the celebration of the Eucharist. To apprehend the mystery of our Faith that is found in Jesus, our lives are both Christ-centered and Spirit-inspired. After going within through worship and Christ centered living, we reach out to the whole "oikoumene" (universe) through active missions and philanthropic outreach to the "least of the brethren." To go beyond ourselves to the other means that ours is a fellowship that is friendly, hospitable, and always seeking the one that is "lost."

As witnesses for Christ, His very presence in the world, we always proclaim and embody Gospel values in all aspects of our mission, even when the outside world is not always in sympathy with such values. Believing that a church on a hill cannot be hid, we always let our light shine before the world, so that it may see our good works and give glory to our Father Who is in Heaven.

#### Reflection

Good morning brothers and sisters in Christ, Christ is in our midst!

This morning's assembly is only two months after our Fall General Assembly. Not much has changed in terms of our goals and our vision. We continue to make progress, slowly, but with much enthusiasm and persistence.

All of our reports that are given today will be available for review on the Holy Cross Website and please take the time to review them. Much effort and planning has gone into their creation.

Just three observations that I would like to share with you this morning.

1. The importance of the meeting! This week we celebrate the Great Feast of Ypapanti! The Meeting of the Lord in the Temple. The feast itself is about Christ going to meet His people in the Temple. Simeon, the old man (perhaps as old as 150 years) is promised that he will not see death until he sees his Redeemer. The Prophetess Anna (84 years of age) also awaits this special moment. Here we see the mercy of God, the fulfillment of the OT Law, and the Light of the world all together in the person of Christ, a forty-day old infant. Having served the parish of Ypapanti for eight years, I truly was blessed to ponder the mystery of this great feast. Most people think it is Ground Hog day and are

worried about the weather. Christ is with us, comes to meet us, sanctifies us and draws us to Himself. Such simplicity and joy, promise and fulfillment, love and compassion. Every time we present a new born child, we cannot help but be uplifted by their presence and remember the encounter of St. Simeon and Jesus.

Perhaps what I have treasured most after these two long years of various regulations, mandates, and restrictions — is our meeting together. We are blessed to have a tradition of house blessings. For me, these are like drops of water in the desert. To sit with you, pray with you in your home, and to enjoy your company. What a blessing! I am so grateful and humbled by your faithful commitment to the Lord, our beloved parish of Holy Cross, and our ministry together. How necessary these meetings are — especially for our young people, our shut-ins, and for all of us. Let us make the time to meet together in the name of Christ our Lord!

Today we have called the General Assembly to the do the necessary business of the Church - to pass a budget. Thanks to all of you, we continue to walk towards our goal of covering all of our expenses through stewardship. Today we also have a special presentation on the beautification of the grounds and how we must strive to beautify and maintain our facilities. We have many things to discuss, but I wanted to begin with expressing my gratitude and joy in being called to serve as your priest. There is always much to be done and we welcome the opportunities and the challenges that accompany our goals.

- 2. The second observation is that there are several of our families, especially those with children that have been hesitant to return to Church. For whatever reason, please encourage them, call them, reach out to them, and remind them that, here, in the Church is where we meet Christ, most especially in the Holy Eucharist.
- 3. Finally, another milestone at Holy Cross. In the past fifteen months between the efforts of our beloved Philoptochos, our Agape Fund, and the budgeted amount directed toward outreach in our annual budget, we have distributed nearly \$200,000.00 in assistance to various philanthropic organizations. 90% in our Pittsburgh area. Although we do not advertise our philanthropy, we should know that our Holy Cross Community is continually seeking opportunities to serve those in need and allow the Light of Christ to shine through these acts of love.

As I mentioned, please give us your attention for the next 45 mins. and we will be able to accomplish the necessary work of the parish. Thank you!
