Friday September 16, 2022 7 PM "EXPERIENCES AND CREATIONS: VAGGELIS ANETOPOULOS"

The Greek Nationality together with the European Art Center of Greece (EUARCE) will present the life and experiences of Vaggelis Anetopoulos, Greece's 20th century ceramic and pottery revivalists. Anetopoulos was a refugee of the Christian Genocide in Asia Minor.

Saturday September 17, 2022 3 PM PROGRAM The Ammenian Nationality Room will be hosting an oral history/Genocide testimony and memory event in collaboration with the University of Southern California Shoath Foundation.

7 PM MEMORIES OF ASIA MINOR IN POEM Winning entries in response to an international poetry competition on the theme will be presented; this competition is a collaboration between the European Art Center of Greece (EUARCE) and the American Hellenic Foundation of Western Pennsylvania.

Sunday September 18, 2022 7 PM "HRIPSIME'S AGONY, ATHENA'S MOURNING, AND RACHEL'S HEARTBREAK

A Musical commemoration of and tribute to martyrs of Christian Genocide in Anatolia, the Pontus and Asia Minor, and Jews in the Holocaust Musical ensembles representing the Jewish Community of Western PA, the Armenian and the Greek Communities of Western PA will come together, inspired by memorial poetry, to offer a tribute and memorial to the martyrs of the darkest chapters of humanity's 20th century history.

Sunday September 25, 2022 5 PM "Mapping Migration, Learning from Oral History: Ottoman Greek Immigration to Western Pennsylvania" A Lecture-Presentation by Dr. Yiorgo Topalidis, Ph.D. Interim Associate Director Samuel Proctor Oral History Project University of Florida Until now, little was known about Greeks in the Ottoman Empire who migrated to America as immigrants prior to the Christian Genocide as well as those who were refugees to America during, and following this dark chapter in the history of Greeks. Dr. Topalidis' groundbreaking research has tracked these migrations to America. His lecture-presentation reveals those who settled in the greater Western PA region. This event is being bosted by the Greek Nationality Rooms and Intercultural Exchange Programs at the University of Pittsburgh, the American Hellenic Foundation of Western PA, and the European Art Center of Greece (EUARCE)

Sunday September 25, 2022 7 PM "The Builders from Asia Minor" A short documentary about the immigrants and refugees from Asia Minor, the Pontus, and Anatolia who helped shape the Greek-American communities of the Tri-State area.

With hymns dedicated to the Neomartyrs of Asia Minor presented by members of the Byzantine Choir of the Greek Orthodox Metropolis of Pittsburgh.

SUNDAY, AUGUST 28, 2022

The reading is from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 9:2-12. Brethren, you are the seal of my apostleship in the Lord. This is my defense to those who would examine me. Do we not have the right to our food and drink? Do we not have the right to be accompanied by a wife, as the other apostles and the brothers of the Lord and Cephas? Or is it only Barnabas and I who have no right to refrain from working for a living? Who serves as a soldier at his own expense? Who plants a vineyard without eating any of its fruit? Who tends a flock without getting some of the milk? Do I say this on human authority? Does not the law say the same? For it is written in the law of Moses, "You shall not muzzle an ox when it is treading out the grain." Is it for oxen that God is concerned? Does he not speak entirely for our sake? It was written for our sake, because the plowman should plow in hope and the thresher thresh in hope of a share in the crop. If we have sown spiritual good among you, is it too much if we reap your material benefits? If others share this rightful claim upon you, do not we still more? Nevertheless, we have not made use of this right, but we endure anything rather than put an obstacle in the way of the gospel of Christ.

The Gospel According to Matthew 18:23-35 The Lord said this parable: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his servants. When he began the reckoning, one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents; and as he could not pay, his lord ordered him to be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and payment to be made. So the servant fell on his knees, imploring him, 'Lord, have patience with me, and I will pay you everything.' And out of pity for him the lord of that servant released him and forgave him the debt. But that same servant, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii; and seizing him by the throat he said, 'Pay what you owe.' So his fellow servant fell down and besought him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.' He refused and went and put him in prison till he should pay the debt. When his fellow servants saw what had taken place, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place. Then his lord summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt because you besought me; and should not you have had mercy on your fellow servant, as I had mercy on you?' And in anger his lord delivered him to the torturers, till he should pay all his debt. So also my heavenly Father will do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother from your heart."
